"PASSENGERS"

→ Some things that you should tell your passengers
PRIOR to departure

- How to exit the aircraft, and remind them to meet you at the tail of the plane should evacuation become necessary
- How to latch the seatbelts, how to UNLATCH the seatbelts
- Where the First Aid Kit & Fire Extinguisher are
- Where the ELT is, and how to turn it on in the event of an emergency - this is one of the MOST important things that you can tell a passenger
- To let you know AS SOON as they start to feel ill, and where the sick bags are stowed
- To let you know if they are too hot or too cold
- To let you know if they see any traffic
- To immediately stop talking whenever you signal



Sterile Cockpit

- Just prior to take-off, it is a good idea to ask your passengers to remain quiet until you depart the circuit
- Prior to entering the circuit it is a good idea to ask your passengers to remain quiet until after you have landed
- When you fly with another pilot, it is a good idea to avoid any idle chat, whenever you are below 500' AGL
